The following article by Ron Harner is an example how one of the persons in the organization spends their free time. We hope that more people in the future, share their experiences with us:

"APPROVED WORKMEN ARE NOT ASHAMED"

Boys and girls are Americas greatest investment. The most fruitful ministry of the Church is telling boys and girls about God's plan of salvation, building them in the Word, and pointing them to their place in God's program. This is why the AWANA Clubs were started.

The AWANA Club is a weekly program consisting of a flag ceremony, game and recreation period, tribe time, announcement time, and Bible council time. The AWANA program can be used by many different denominations since it doesn't go into church doctrine. Boys and girls can come from other churches (in the area) and participate without loosing out because they don't attend the church with the AWANA program. This also holds true for Catholic boys and girls because all verses that the AWANA program uses are found in the Catholic Bible.

The boys and girls are divided into various groups. For example, the boys groups are pals (eight-ten), pioneers (eleven-thirteen) and pilots (fifteen-eighteen). Then a name is given to each age group. Pals are classified as Hunters, (eight); Braves (nine) and Warriors (ten).

Each boy and girl that comes to an AWANA Club is assigned a color (red, blue, green gold) during game time so that team points can be awarded to each group. For an example: Blue Pals, Red Pals, Green Pals or Gold Pals. Points are given for wearing the AWANA uniform, reciting a section in the AWANA book, bringing their books, and of course for each game they win.

Much could be stated about the boys and girls handbook, but to make it simple, it consists of sections to be passed by memorization. The book sections are divided into Rank, Drills, and Crafts. As a boy or girl passes their mark, they receive their rank insignias to wear on their uniform. As they pass the crafts and sword drills they receive the achievement bars to be worn on the uniform.

It takes church workers to organiza and run a good AWANA program. Our AWANA program is three years old. Last year we had two hundred boys and girls. This year we have four hundred. We have seventy adults active in the program. What better way to show boys and girls about God's plan of salvation; and boys and girls are interested. Their number shows it. II Timothy 2:15 "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a Workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." (AWANA)
