


Have faith in God's ultimate knowledge and wisdom - above yours.


Love life - and fear of death will never trouble you.





Sue Ramsby (Line 1) will be moving to a new home that she will be sharing with her sister.


Karen Troxel (Line 4) will be on vacation for two weeks. She's planning on just taking it easy.

Dear Friend of the Sloats,

Greetings from warm, sunny Wakarusa. What a pleasure to have some good warm Brazilian weather. We trust that your summer is going well.

As you recall, our March letter to you asked for prayer in behalf of God's direction for our immediate ministry. Let me tell you how He has directed. For the next year we will continue our communication's ministry with Taylor University, an interdenominational evangelical school. I will be instructor of radio and television as well as director of the television services department and faculty advisor to the college radio station.

That means then that we will have another change of address and so after August 1 our address will be:

Sloat  
Taylor University  
Upland, IN 46989

We have been given a one year leave-of-absence from the Overseas Department of the Missionary Church. Our Taylor contract is also for one year. During this time we will continue to seek God's direction in our lives.

The highlight of our lives during the past seven months has been renewed contact with family and friends. Renewed contact with you! Living here in Wakarusa, deputation in the midwest and Canada, travel to Oregon and Washington has put us in contact with many of those people who have made our ministry possible in Brazil during the past 16 years. We thank God for them and especially for you!

We have appreciated our relationship with the Overseas Department of the Missionary Church and World Gospel Mission through the years. Although we will not be recognized as "official" missionaries with these organizations during the next year, our hearts are still in missions and we plan for continued involvement in that Taylor is located near both headquarters.

We have had regular contact with Brazil. We are pleased to know that the ministry continues as usual. Even though we are not involved in the work personally in Brazil we have pledged our prayer and financial support and we encourage you to do the same with us. We believe in what is being done in Brazil. If you have a personal share in our ministry through WGM, you may continue to share in Brazil radio or transfer to another missionary of your choice.

Kevin and Marci have done well in adjusting to a new environment. Today Kevin is working at Grandpa Sloat's farm and Marci is at a junior's camp. The move of course will mean another new school and set of friends so pray for them. Bonnie would appreciate your prayers too regarding her desire to study family and marital counseling. I will have my mind stretched in the young world of ideas.

Let me say again that we have appreciated your investment in us and the ministry through the years. We thank God for you and for His direction. We would ask you to continue to pray for Brazil, Marcos Caldas and the radio ministries. Would you as well pray for us that we will be able to accomplish His will at Taylor and be sensitive to His direction during the year.

# kalorie korner

FROM THE KITCHEN OF BETTY MOHR

## Peach-A-berry Cobbler

2 T. Cornstarch  
1/2 C brown sugar  
1 1/4 C Cold water  
2 C. sliced fresh peaches  
1 C fresh blueberries  
1 T. Butter  
1 T. lemon juice

Cobbler Crust:  
1 C Flour  
1 1/2 t. baking powder  
1/2 t. salt  
1/2 C. milk  
1/4 C butter  
2 T sugar  
1/4 t. nutmeg

Mix first 3 ing.; add fruits. Cook and stir til mixture thickens. Add butter and lemon juice. Pour into 8 1/4 x 1 3/4 inch round ovenware cake dish. Cobbler Crust: sift together flour, 1/2 C sugar, baking powder and salt. Add milk and butter all at once; beat smooth. Pour over fruit. Mix 2 T. sugar and nutmeg. Sprinkle over batter. Bake in mod. oven (350 degree) for 30 minutes or til done. Serve warm with cream. Makes 6 servings. Note: Or use canned or frozen fruits. Drain, use 1/2 C or more syrup instead of water.

## Super Fudgy Saucepan Brownies

1 C Flour	2 C. sugar
1 t. each, baking powder, Salt	4 eggs
4 to 6 squares chocolate	2 t. vanilla
2/3 C butter	1 1/2 C. chopped nuts

Mix well flour, baking powder and salt; set aside. In large saucepan melt chocolate and butter. Stir in sugar, eggs, vanilla and flour mixture then nuts. Turn into greased 13 x 9 x 2 inch pan. Bake at 350 degree for 25 min. Cool in pan, cut into 48 bars, turn onto serving plate. Cool completely. If desired, dust with powdered sugar. 16 servings.

## Mushrooms - Marinated

1 pound fresh mushrooms cleaned - DO NOT COOK  
1 C red wine vinegar  
1/2 C olive oil or veg oil  
1/2 t liquid garlic  
1/2 t. salt  
1/2 t. sugar  
2 T chopped chives

Marinate mushrooms in 1/2 gallon jar for 48 hours.



### A Thought


As I stand atop a hill
