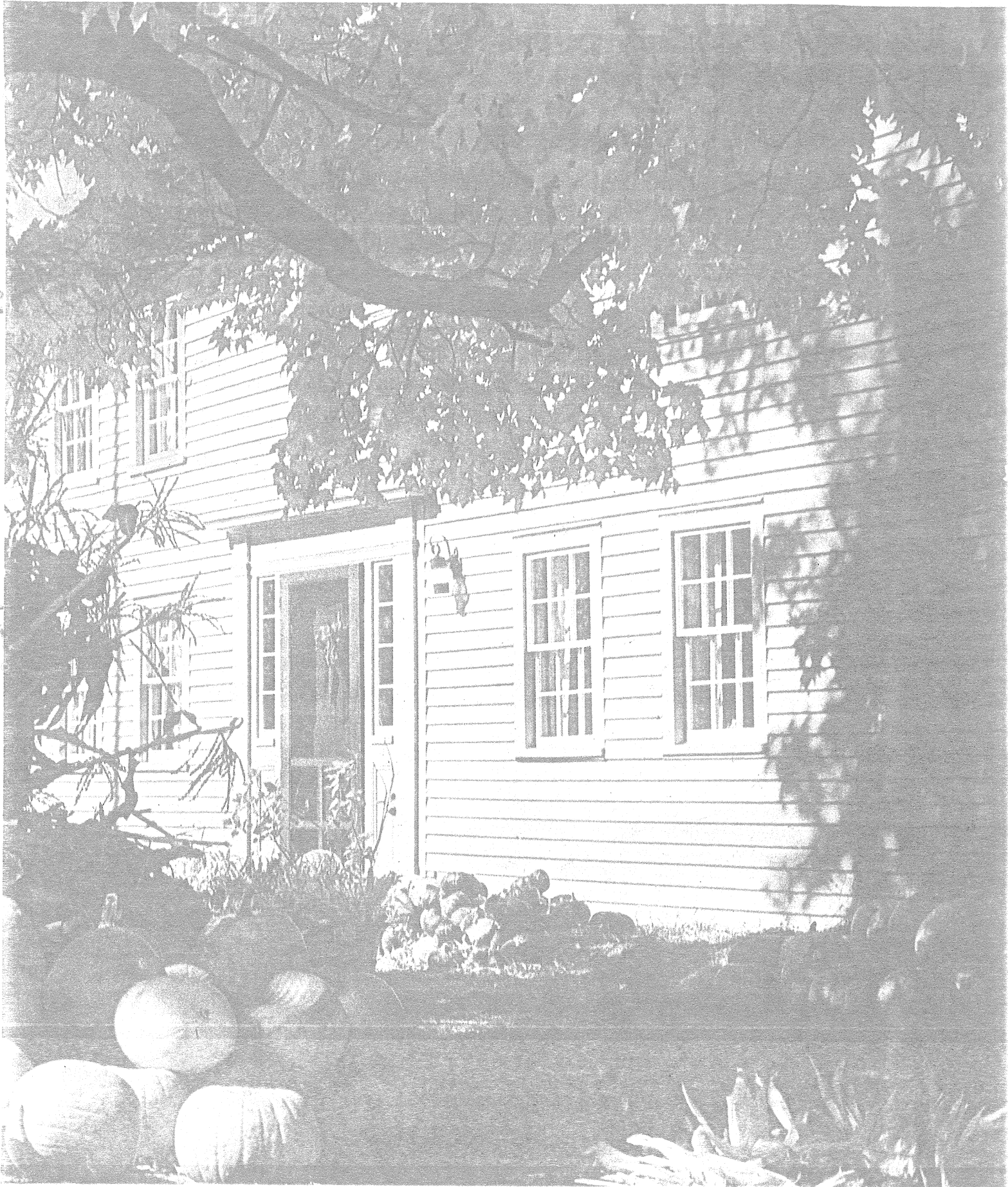

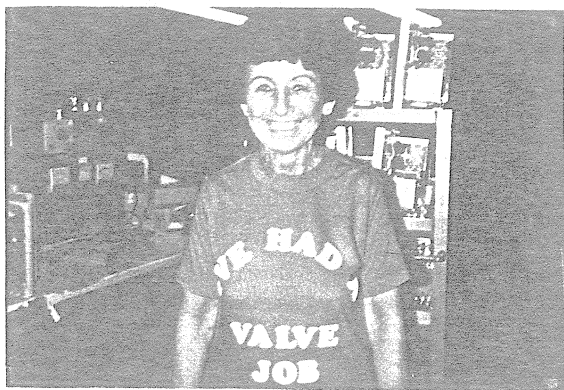
JODIE WADE (Stockroom) had a baby boy, Christopher David. Jodie plans to be a full time mother.

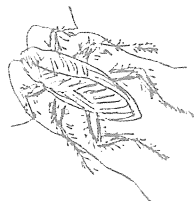

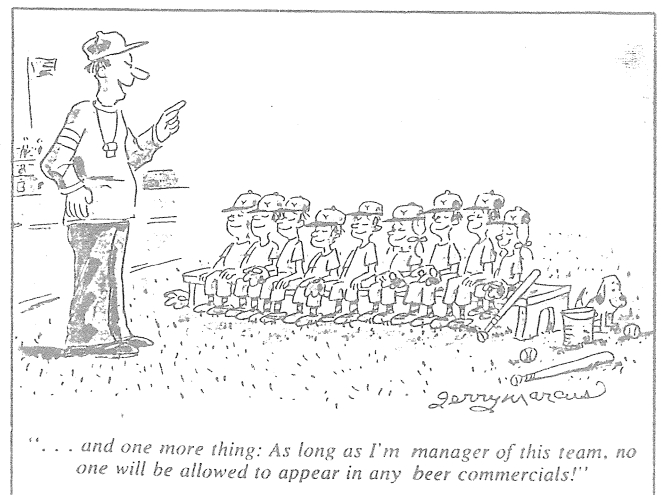

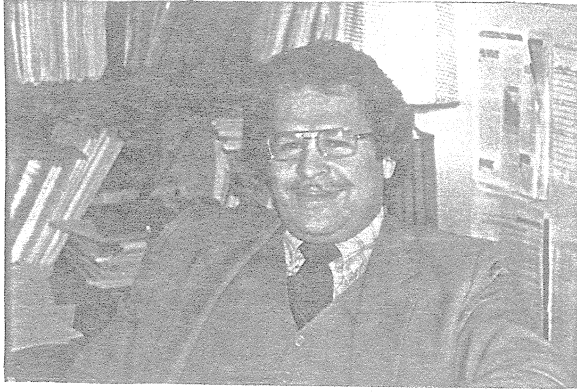

This column has not shown up in public for a year or so. Of course, this has deprived you readers of a valuable resource in your struggle to make sense of cultural surroundings that threaten to blow apart at the seams any moment. I regret this shortage in your personal development, but it could not be helped. For the past year I have been secretly researching important subjects illumination. A lot of what I've learned is probably not true. Some of it is. It's terribly hard to tell the difference.

In any case, future months will reveal all of these new things to those of you who can read. If you cannot read (and how are you reading this if you cannot read?), you may count yourself well off. The disturbing things I report will not bother you.

Before we get into any serious considerations we may as well discuss the political prospects for the U.S. It is too late for the Cubs, but maybe not for the country. In fact, there is not much wrong with our country that Abraham Lincoln or Thomas Jefferson could not fix. Unfortunately, neither of them is on the ballot this time.

I do not have strong personal objections to either Ronald Reagan or Walter Mondale. Each seems to be sincere at times, well-meaning for the most part, and fairly honest as politicians go. Neither is as brilliant or innovative as he thinks he is, but that is a good thing because it will make it harder for whichever one is elected to fool the rest of us.

What keeps me awake nights is the realization that behind every President we elect has stood an entire political party. "Party" is not a bad name, -- it means, "Having a riotous time with someone else's money."

Every political party includes opportunists, con artists, and others who never learned a useful profession. Many of them have been elected to Congress. The rest serve as aides, assistants, advisors, and hangers-on. If our country goes off the track, these will be the ones shovelling coal and yanking on the throttle.

But I have an idea. To appreciate this idea you need to consider R. David's First Law of Ideas: a) A man with a great idea will cautiously tell a select few people; b) A man with a mediocre idea will inflict it on his entire family and most of his neighbors; c) A man who cannot distinguish between a useful idea and the bottom of a parrot cage will rent a sound track and buy TV time in order to distribute his mental refuse.

I am modestly and cautiously sharing this idea with the select few who read this column. Like all great ideas, it is simple in concept, but hard as heck to pull off.

The key is to keep political parties from becoming organized well enough to take advantage of the rest of us. What we would do is decree a massive trading of personnel after the election. The President-elect would have to, a) switch parties; and b) switch all advisors, party hacks, Vice-Presidents, and everyone else with the loser.

Suppose Mondale won. He would then become a Republican and adopt Bush, Baker, Speakes, Stockman, and a few thousand others. Reagan, now a democrat, would end up with Ferraro, Cuomo, O'Neil, and the rest of that crew. He would probably have to pay off Mondale's campaign debt as well. But he wouldn't have to apologize to anyone for losing -- all his associates would be happily employed by the other guy.

Trying to figure out the benefits of winning and losing in this case would strangle the finest political intellects (a contradiction in terms if ever there was one) in the land. Vice presidential candidates would be chosen with extreme care. If Walter chose Billy Carter, for instance, in order to stick Ronnie with Billy after the election, Ronnie might get even by selecting Bella Abzug. The Vice-Presidential material would be busy campaigning for the other side anyway in hopes of having a job when it was all over.

People would switch parties frantically as they tried to decide if they wanted to be in a losing group joining a winning president, or in a winning group being shovelled off on the loser.

This intrigue would keep everyone off-balance and disorganized, and much less likely to produce the schemes that transfer our money to their accounts and pet projects.

In the Declaration of Independence, Tom Jefferson said of the King of England (among many other criticisms): "He has erected a multitude of new offices, and sent hither swarms of officers to harrass our people and eat out their substance." As fine a description of a political party at work as you could want.

Write your Congressman about this idea. Use short words, so he'll understand.

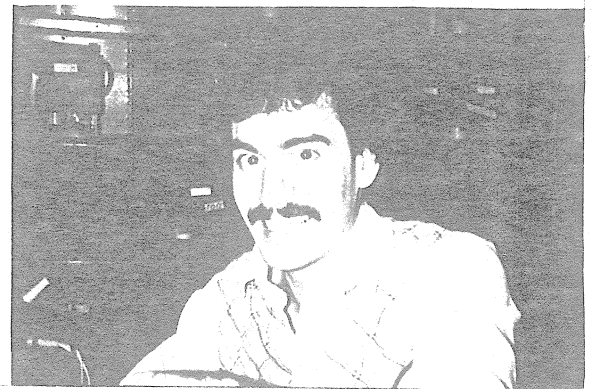

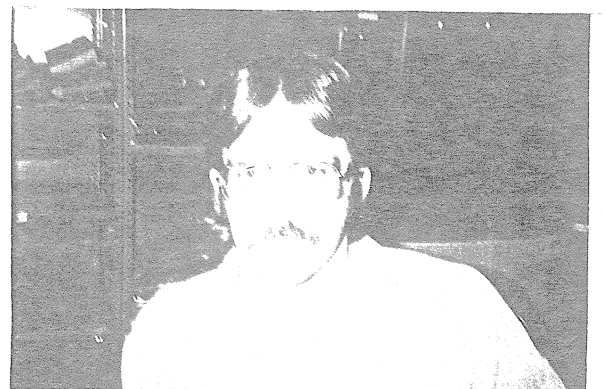

Once you have "opened" your insurance file at Benefit Trust Life you will not need to send in another "blue" form unless an accident is involved. In the case of a non-work related accident BTL will pay from the first dollar up to \$300.00. Then, Major Medical will apply with the \$100 deductible and the 80/20% split of costs.

When you receive medical services, please show the bookkeeper your blue insurance card with the group number on it. Your bills should go directly to BTL, being sent either by you or the one providing services. Reimbursement will go to the one you have designated by the way you sign the form. If you sign the area marked "I authorize payment of medical benefits to undersigned physician ...", the check will be sent to the supplier of services. If you do not sign the form, the check will be sent directly to you.

As always, I am here to help you when you have questions concerning insurance or you can call BTL direct by dialing the phone number on your blue insurance card.

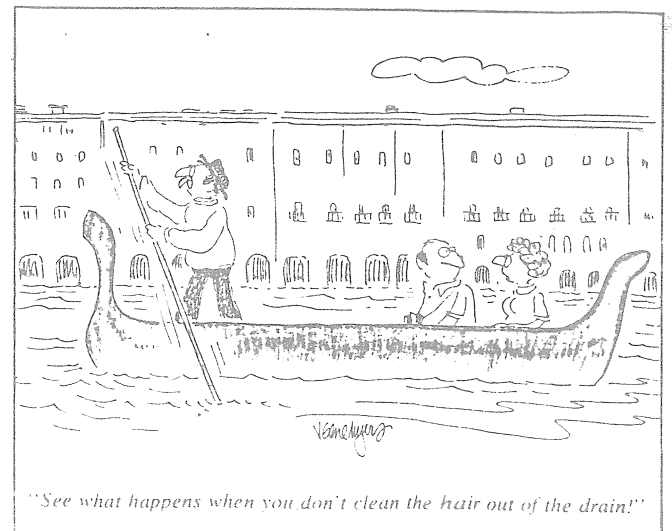

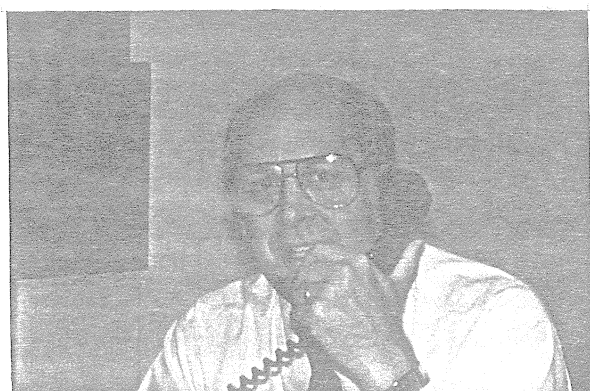

## Sloppy Joe Potato Pizza

- 1 bag (32 oz.) Frozen Shredded Hash Browns, Thawed
- 1 can (11 oz.) Cheddar Cheese Soup
- 1 Egg
- 1 t. Salt
- 1/2 t. Pepper
- 8 oz. Shredded Cheddar Cheese
- 1 pound Ground Beef
- 1 can (15-1/2 oz) Canned Sandwich Sauce for Sloppy Joes
- 2 T. Minced Onion

In a large bowl, mix together hash browns, soup, egg, salt and pepper. Spread potato mixture over a buttered large pizza pan. Bake in a 450 degree oven for 20-25 minutes.

Meanwhile, saute ground beef and onions; drain fat. Stir in Sloppy Joe sauce and simmer 5 minutes. Sprinkle 2/3 of the cheese over the baked potato crust. Spoon meat mixture over cheese and top with remaining cheese. Bake 5 minutes longer. Makes 1 pizza.

Heat oven to 250 degrees.

Place cereals and nuts in a large roasting pan. Melt butter and add seasonings. Pour over mixed cereals/nuts. Place in oven and bake one hour stirring every 15 minutes.
