First Season

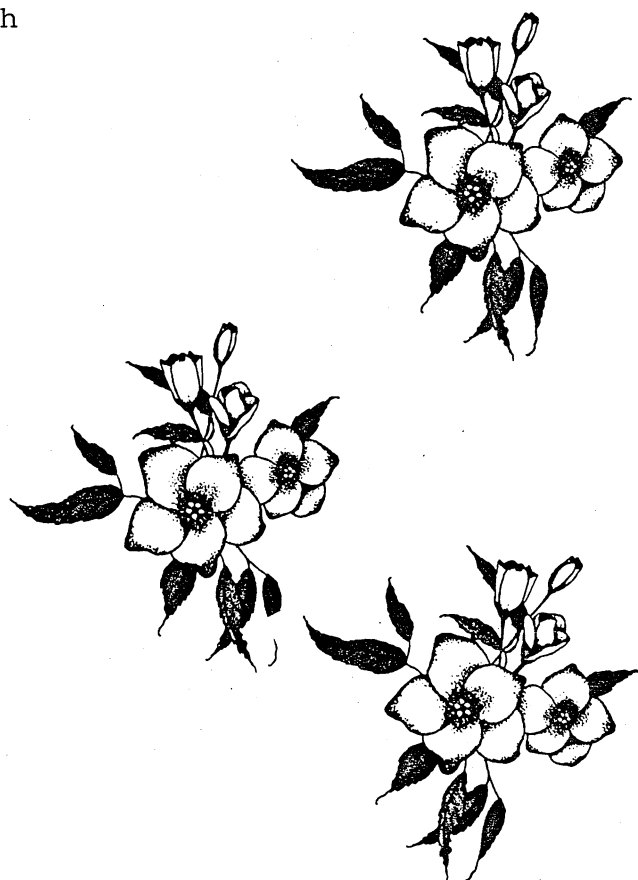
Spring is a crocus

Dedication of a day to mothers is relatively new to the United States. It was not until 1908 that the first such special day was held, but the tradition of setting aside a time for the public expression of love for mothers dates back to the ancient Greek empire. It was continued in pagan Rome and later by the early Christians in honor of the Virgin Mary. In England an ecclesiastical decree expanded the holiday to include all mothers. Perhaps because many of the early settlers in the United States were not members of the established church of England, they did not bring this celebration with them. It was not until the early 1900s that Miss Anna Jarvis succeeded, through a national letter-writing crusade, in establishing a new tradition. On Sunday, May 10, 1908, Miss Jarvis' mother was honored at a special service for which Anna donated 500 white carnations to be worn by everyone in attendance. From that gesture stems the custom of wearing flowers to honor one's mother. In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed the second Sunday in May "a public expression of love and reverence for mothers of this country." In 1943, a stamp of the painting of Whistler's mother was issued as a tribute to all mothers, past and present. Today flowers and gifts, candy and cards combine with phone calls or visits home to make Mother's Day a special one for women across the land. On this day, grateful daughters and sons and husbands attempt to express their warm thoughts and thanks to mothers and wives who have meant so much.

kalorie korner

FROM THE KITCHEN OF: Diana Long

Mexican Bean Dish

- 1 lb. ground beef
- 1 can red beans
- 1 15 oz. can enchilada sauce (mild)
- 1 8 oz. can tomato sauce
- 1 Tbsp. instant minced onion
- 2 c. shredded cheddar cheese
- 1-1/2 c. dairy sour cream

Brown ground beef. Combine enchilada sauce, tomato sauce and onion. Add to ground beef. Set aside 1 cup corn chips and 1/2 cup cheese. Mix beans with remaining chips, cheese, and meat mixture. Put in 2 quart casserole and bake uncovered at 375 for 20-25 minutes. Remove from oven and spread top with sour cream, remaining chips, and cheese. Bake 3-4 minutes longer.

Yeast Rolls

- 2 pkg. active dry yeast
- 3/4 cup warm water
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 tsp. salt
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 cup shortening
- 4 cups flour

Dissolve yeast in water. Stir in sugar and salt. Add eggs and shortening and 2 cups flour. Beat until smooth. Then mix in remaining flour until smooth. Cover and let rise 1-1/2 hours. Divide and make rolls in your favorite shape. Let rise again for one hour. Bake 12-15 minutes.

Apple Cake

| 1 cup butter | 1 tsp. cinnamon |
| 1-1/2 cup white sugar | 1/4 tsp. nutmeg |
| 3 eggs | 1 tsp. vanilla |
| 3 cups flour | 3 cups chopped apples |
| 1-1/2 tsp. soda | 2 cups chopped walnuts |
| 1/2 tsp. salt | |

Cream butter and sugar till fluffy. Add eggs one at a time, beat well after each. Mix and sift flour, soda, salt, and spices. Add gradually to butter and sugar mixture. Stir in vanilla, chopped apples, and nuts. Batter will be stiff. Spoon into greased and floured 10" tube pan. Bake at 325 for 1-1/2 hours. Cool 10 minutes and remove from pan.
