The Case for Mars III

University of Colorado, Boulder / July 18 thru 22, 1987

MARK STANLEY, from Osceola, Indiana, a recent graduate of Penn High School and a summer employee of Crown International, just returned from a week with the stars - stars of the worldwide aerospace science community. They met for a conference at the University of Colorado in Boulder, July 18 through 22 to present "The


Case for Mars III: Strategies for Exploration" sponsored by The Planetary Society, NASA ARC, NASA MSFC, NASA JSC, Jet Propulsion Laboratory, The American Astronautical Society, and Los Alamos National Laboratory.

Mark was one of those stars. He won \$750 and an all expense paid week by submitting a paper he originally wrote in April for his Advanced Composition Class at Penn High School. This Contest was sponsored by the Planetary Society Mars Institute. The object was to design an international mission to Mars.



The mission plan submitted by each contestant was supposed to consider the technologies of all space-faring nations including launch capabilities and satellite technology. Canada, the Soviet Union, the United States, Japan, the European Space Agency and more were to be included. Mark successfully did just that.

The Mars Institute Contest Award was presented by Christopher P. McKay, NASA ARC, at the close of the morning Plenary Session, Monday, July 20. In presenting the check to Mark, McKay emphasized that sixteen year old Mark Stanley had competed against teams of college students and scientists to win the award for the contest.



University of Colorado President, Dr. Gordon Gee, had opened the first session Monday. Other well known speakers were the Conference Chairman, Thomas O. Paine, who gave the Welcome and Dr. James E. Fletcher, Administrator, NASA, who gave the Keynote Address.

Astronauts Michael Collins and Buzz Aldrin whose autographs appear above, then presented "Apollo 11 - Mars". Other reviews presented were the Soviet Mars Program by Bruce Murray of the California Institute of Technology and the Vice President of the Planetary Society, (the third autograph above), The Role of Science in Mars Exploration, Mission Strategy - a Historical Perspective, and Life Science Issues.

When reading the Conference Program it is obvious that Mark's paper was comprehensive in its coverage of the aspects of a mission to Mars. Over two hundred papers were presented discussing these aspects including everything from human factors involved to advanced propulsion and power sources.

During the workshops Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, Mark met and talked to other students and scientists and was especially impressed by their dedication to science and the diversity of their backgrounds and interests. For example, Mark talked with Phil Hawes of Space Biospheres II, whose paper was titled "Towards a Permanent Settlement on Mars". Phil is an architect - a synergetic architect of biotechnic design and regional communities.


Mark's major interest was in the Advanced Propulsion Session conducted by Steve Howe of the Los Alamos National Lab and Dave Byers, NASA LeRC. Mark will be entering a new program at Purdue University in the fall for the study of physical science and aeronautical engineering and plans to do further research in propulsion when possible. High school out of the way, Mark says, "Now I can begin my education!"

His only disappointment at the conference was not getting to meet Carl Sagan whose TV series "Cosmos" was an inspiration to Mark. Sagan gave a lecture on Mars and participated in a panel discussion for a public program July 19 then left the conference. Mark was surprised, as were others, at Sagan's negative comments about NASA, his sponsor for the conference.

Mark's parents, Ellen and Gerald Stanley, and brother Randy, all joined Mark at the Conference. Randy and Mark explored the mountains around Boulder on mountain bikes, peddling over rocks and through streams with plenty of whoop-de-

doos and a few bumps and bruises to clear their brains in the mountain air.

While Randy used Mark's ticket to fly home, Mark and his parents drove, stopping to visit the seven story National Forecasting Center in Kansas City, Missouri on the way. Studying storms and astronomy are hobbies Gerald and Mark share. Mark uses the telescope his Dad built years ago.



Currently Mark is busy working on a short paper to submit as a requirement for receiving a college credit for attending the conference. It is interesting to note that his paper, as submitted to his high school English teacher, received only a "B" since it did not include a Preface as required.

The winning contest entry did have a Preface. In it Mark says, "Writing about the various space programs and the mission has had a strong effect on me. The lesson to be learned from this is a powerful one that deals with cooperation and trust."

In thirteen concise pages Mark explains existing technologies in various nations which can be used for a mission to Mars. The long-term reliability of electronic components used in the United States Pioneer, Voyager and Apollo space programs, the Soviet's twelve year experience studying the effects of space flight on the astronauts and the European Space Agency's participation in planning an international space station are examples.

He details the spacecraft, the rockets, the modules housing scientific, medical and exercise facilities, and the manpower to handle them. In-space activities, the details of landing, an automated meteorological and seismic station to study Mars, and the methods for returning to Earth are discussed.

In researching his paper Mark spent hours at the Notre Dame library with "a pile of books". He is an avid reader of SKY AND TELESCOPE and ASTRONOMY magazines as well as the Planetary Society publication in which he first read about the Mars contest.

Mark thanks his parents Ellen and Gerald Stanley for their encouragement and help in checking punctuation, spelling and capitalization but claims any errors in content as his own.

In his conclusion to this hypothetical mission to Mars, Mark states, "As the participating nations prepare for the next mission, they will be drawn towards the awareness that in exploring the outer spaces, they have explored the inner spaces of friendship and international cooperation. Both having been little explored by man, bear great promise for all."


In addition to dancing Gloria will play her Irish Drum, the Bodhron, and the bones, used by the minstrels for years.




